4TH OF JULY BOATING SAFETY TIPS

Thursday is the Fourth of July and there's no better time to take the boat out on the water than Independence Day. **Summer is in full swing so the weather is beautiful, so now is a good time to take advantage of your day off.** However, everyone else has the same idea as you. Many more boaters take to the water on Independence Day, and along with Memorial Day and Labor Day, these holidays account for more than one-third of all boating related accidents and fatalities. Whether you choose to take your boat out off the coast of Cape Cod or up to the lakes in New Hampshire **aim to keep safe by adhering to these boating safety tips:**

Wear a Lifejacket

It's tempting to take off your lifejacket when the weather is bright and hot, but it's best to leave it on for your own safety. **Accidents happen quickly, and often there isn't time to think about putting a lifejacket on when an accident happens.** Ensure that everyone on the boat has a lifejacket and wears it at all times.

Maintain the Vessel

Before heading out on the waters, ensure your boat is up for the task. More often than not, 4th of July is the only time people venture out on the water after dark. **Make sure your vehicle is in good condition and your navigation lights work so you can be better seen.**

Be Prepared for Emergencies

Take time to familiarize yourself with safety equipment, emergency procedures, and know how to contact authorities, should something go wrong. If you boat up in an area that requires flares, make sure they are up to date. Never use a flare as a form of a firework – this could be dangerous and constitutes as a fake distress call.

Early June 2019 Hypoxia Report

Dissolved oxygen conditions in the Maryland portion of the Chesapeake Bay mainstem were slightly above the long-term average in early June. The hypoxic water volume — areas with less than 2 mg/l oxygen — was 1.14 cubic miles, which is slightly above the early June 1985-2018 average of 0.93 cubic miles and similar to levels in 2017 and 2018.



A significant amount of hypoxia was also observed during May. Hypoxia was not observed in Virginia's portion of the bay, and no anoxic zones — areas with less than 0.2 mg/l oxygen — were detected in the mainstem bay in either Maryland or Virginia.

The observed early June and May hypoxia conditions are likely attributable to near record high flows in 2018 that continued into the spring of 2019.

Heavy rainfall and runoff delivers more nutrients, which fuels algal blooms, and in turn consumes oxygen upon their decay. The delivery of high volumes of fresh water also acts to increase water column stratification that can inhibit atmospheric oxygen in the surface layers from mixing into deeper waters of the bay.

In the beginning of June, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, U.S. Geological Survey, University of Maryland Center for Environmental Science and University of Michigan scientists predicted a large hypoxic volume for the bay in 2019 due to higher flows last fall and this spring, and higher nitrogen loading from the Susquehanna and Potomac Rivers.

Crabs, fish, oysters, and other creatures in the Chesapeake Bay require oxygen to survive. Scientists and natural resource managers study the volume and duration of bay hypoxia to determine possible impacts to bay life. Each year from June through September, the Maryland Department of Natural Resources computes these volumes from data collected by Maryland and Virginia monitoring teams during twice-monthly monitoring cruises. Data collection is funded by these states and the Environmental Protection Agency's Chesapeake Bay Program.

Bay hypoxia monitoring and reporting will continue through the summer.

Patriotic Dessert

Ingredients

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup finely chopped pecans
- 1/2 cup butter, softened
- 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- 1 carton (8 ounces) frozen whipped topping
- 1-1/2 cups cold milk
- 1 package (5.1 ounces) instant vanilla pudding mix
- 3 cups fresh strawberries, halved
- 1/2 cup fresh blueberries



How to Make

1. In a bowl, combine flour, pecans and butter. Press into an ungreased 13x9-in. baking dish.
2. Bake at 350° for 18-20 minutes. Cool on a wire rack.
3. In a bowl, beat cream cheese and confectioners' sugar. Fold in half the whipped topping; spread over crust. In another bowl, whisk milk and pudding mix for 2 minutes. Let stand for 2 minutes
4. Spread over cream cheese layer. Cover with remaining whipped topping. Decorate with strawberries and blueberries to resemble a flag. Chill for at least 1 hour before serving.

All-American Hamburgers

Ingredients:

- 1 pound ground beef
- 2 tablespoons finely chopped onion
- 2 tablespoons chili sauce
- 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- 2 teaspoons prepared mustard
- 4 slices process American cheese or cheddar cheese
- 2 slices Swiss cheese, halved diagonally
- 4 hamburger buns, split and toasted



How to Make

1. Combine first five ingredients, mixing lightly but thoroughly. Shape into four patties.
2. Grill burgers, covered, on a greased rack over medium direct heat until a thermometer reads 160° and juices run clear, about 6 minutes on each side.
3. During the last minute of cooking, top each patty with two triangles of American cheese and one triangle of Swiss cheese. Top with lettuce, tomato, onion, bacon, ketchup or mustard.
